Privacy Policy

BAFRA Privacy Vision

BAFRA is committed to responsible use of information and protecting individual privacy rights. We aspire to protect privacy of our membership by secure use of data we hold and ensuring that partners we work with have safeguards, policies and processes in place which ensure the level of protection we apply to data ourselves.

Security

Data security is an imperative to BAFRA. BAFRA strives to protect personally identifiable information that we maintain for the running of British American Football officiating through the use of appropriate administrative, physical and technical protections so that it is not obtained by unauthorised parties or used impermissibly.

Distribution of Personally Identifiable Information

During the course of our business it may be required to share information with select partners to enable us to maintain the running of the company. In these cases partners will be selected only if they have satisfactory controls in place which at least mirror those of BAFRA.

Accuracy

BAFRA strives to ensure all information held is accurate. BAFRA recognises information may change and become inaccurate and where this has occurred it will be possible for the membership to correct this information by the process outlines in the **Access and Correction** section.

Education

BAFRA will ensure that its directors and members are advised and kept abreast of the responsibilities in applicable law that covers the collection, storage and use of information held.

Access and Correction

Where an individual has data to which BAFRA is the data controller the individual will have the right to request a copy of this information and provide corrections to this where required. All such requests should be made to the company secretary and/or data protection officer.

Applicable Laws

For the purposes of this document applicable laws will consist of the General Data Protection Regulation 2016/679, also known as the General Data Protection Regulation or GDPR and the Data Protection Act 2018, also known as the UK Data Protection Act.
